Hello SCCM Texas Chapter Members!! I hope your summer is off to a great start. The Texas Chapter has been very busy over the last several months. We have had great educational programming, sometimes twice a month in several of our regions, and our symposium committee is hard at work planning the fall symposium. We hit a high of 549 chapter members in May, with nearly 50 of these members active in leadership positions or serving on one of our seven committees.

We set out with several big goals for 2017, and are well on our way in implementing them. The first charge was to utilize our budget surplus to improve programming and member benefits. We have used some of this money to fund three non-industry sponsored local chapter meetings with speakers from our Speaker's Bureau (sign up today on our website!), and are in the process of planning member social events in each of the four regions. These social events will allow members to network and socialize outside of the work setting. We are also in the process of creating and implementing scholarships for our student members, and an ICU research grant via the research committee.

Planning for our biggest event of the year, the Annual Symposium, is coming along nicely. The 6th Annual SCCM Texas Chapter Symposium, "Controversies in Critical Care" will take place on September 8th and 9th, 2017 at Hotel Galvez and Spa in Galveston, TX. We have finalized a program, which includes five different sessions and two debates, and are in the process of securing speakers and continuing education. Lastly, as many of you know, the SCCM Annual Congress will be held in San Antonio in February of 2018. SCCM is already well underway planning an excellent week of meetings. During Congress, the Texas Chapter will be involved with several other organizations in carrying out a large public health event for the people of San Antonio. More information to come soon, and we will be reaching out to members interested in volunteering for this event. Stay tuned!

I would like to finish by thanking our volunteers for all of their hard work so far in 2017. The chapter benefits tremendously from the efforts of our volunteers, who help us implement changes and new ideas based on member feedback. 



Research highlight: Alonso Andrade MD, Alan Tyroch MD, Susan McLean MD, Jody Smith MD, and Alex Ramos MD at the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center, University Medical Center of El Paso recently published an evaluation of surveillance duplex ultrasound of upper (UE) and lower extremities (LE) for deep vein thrombosis (DVT) in trauma ICU patients. Over a 5 year period 136 patients were identified as having a DVT. Seventy-one (52.2%) patients had a DVT in the upper extremity, 61 (44.9%) in the lower extremity, and 4 (2.9%) in both locations. Interestingly, 6.7% of the patients with an UE DVT also developed a pulmonary embolism. Based on their data they suggest it would be beneficial for trauma centers, which screen for LE DVTs also include the UEs. Pediatric Fundamental Critical Care Support (PFCCS)

PFCCS is a structured course developed by the Society of Critical Care Medicine (SCCM). SCCM offers a course completion card to those who successfully complete the course.

The PFCCS curriculum is intended to introduce principles important in the initial care of critically ill/injured pediatric patients. Candidates include physicians, physicians-in-training, nurses, and other health care providers who may or may not be skilled in critical care, but who must care for such patients during early stabilization and in anticipation of the arrival of an intensivist or specialist, or pending transfer to a tertiary center.

FEATURING

The program includes in-depth and comprehensive two-day program using a balance of didactic lectures and hands-on skill stations to include pre- and post-testing.

CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDITS
