Happy Holidays SCCM Texas Chapter Members!! I hope your fall has gone well and you had a happy and healthy holiday season. The Texas Chapter has been very busy over the past 12 months. In addition to maintaining the momentum the chapter gained over the last few years, we also set a few big goals to accomplish. The first charge was to utilize our budget surplus to improve programming and member benefits. We have a significant amount of money to fund several non-industry sponsored meetings, and are in the process of having social events in each region. These social events will allow members to network and socialize outside of the work setting. We also established a Speakers Bureau, with over 20 speakers, many of whom spoke at local events and our annual symposium. We are also in the process of creating and implementing an ICU research grant via the research committee, and have awarded two scholarships for members to attend congress. Another goal was to improve use of technology; we successfully incorporated online webinars for our executive and board of directors meetings, and used the online webinar portal to have four remote speakers present at our symposium.

Our biggest educational event of the year, our annual symposium, was extremely successful! We took the show on the road to the Hotel Galvez and Spa in Galveston, TX, and it did not disappoint. We had over 20 multidisciplinary speakers present on a wide variety of topics. Be sure to check out our website (Annual Symposium tab) to view selected presentations from the event. We also had some excellent research snapshot presentations that allowed members to highlight their research studies in front of a large audience. The 6th Annual Symposium was a hit, and we are already planning next year's event in Dallas - October 19th & 20th, 2018 at Texas Presbyterian Hospital. The SCCM Annual Congress will be held in San Antonio in February of 2018. SCCM is already well underway planning an excellent week of meetings. Please be sure to join us for the Texas Chapter Business Meeting and Reception on Sunday, February 25th from 5-6:30PM at the Grand Hyatt (Bowie B Room). An assortment of food and snacks will be provided in addition to a drink ticket (or two).






Communications Committee Update


Awards Committee Update

Who Should Attend?

The PFCCS curriculum is intended to introduce principles important in the initial care of critically ill/injured pediatric patients.

Candidates include physicians, physicians-in-training, nurses, and other health care providers who may or may not be skilled in critical care, but who must care for such patients during early stabilization and in anticipation of the arrival of an intensivist or specialist, or pending transfer to a tertiary center.

We are now accepting registrations for the Pediatric Fundamental Critical Care Support (PFCCS) course to be held **February 22 – 23, 2018 at The Children's Hospital of San Antonio**. This is a pre-congress course in conjunction with the 47th Critical Care Congress in San Antonio.

PFCCS is a structured course developed by the Society of Critical Care Medicine (SCCM). This two-day program includes in-depth and comprehensive balance of didactic lectures and hands-on skill stations to include pre- and post- testing. SCCM offers a course completion card to those who successfully complete the course.
