Eligibility Criteria

Practitioners from all disciplines of Critical Care Medicine who fulfill the criteria listed below are encouraged to apply.

- Critical care medicine research completed within the previous 12 months: This research may have previously been presented in abstract form or as a poster, but cannot be a published peer-reviewed manuscript.
- Research in Progress and Case Reports will be accepted, but are not eligible for the Symposium Awards.

Application Process

- All application materials must be submitted online by **midnight, August 22 2019**.

Symposium Awards

- Up to \$500 in reimbursement for poster costs and the travel fees for SCCM Texas Chapter Symposium for **Completed Research only**
- Two Separate Categories for the Symposium Award
 - Up to 2 years of clinical experience for Completed Research
 - More than 2 years of clinical experience for Completed Research
